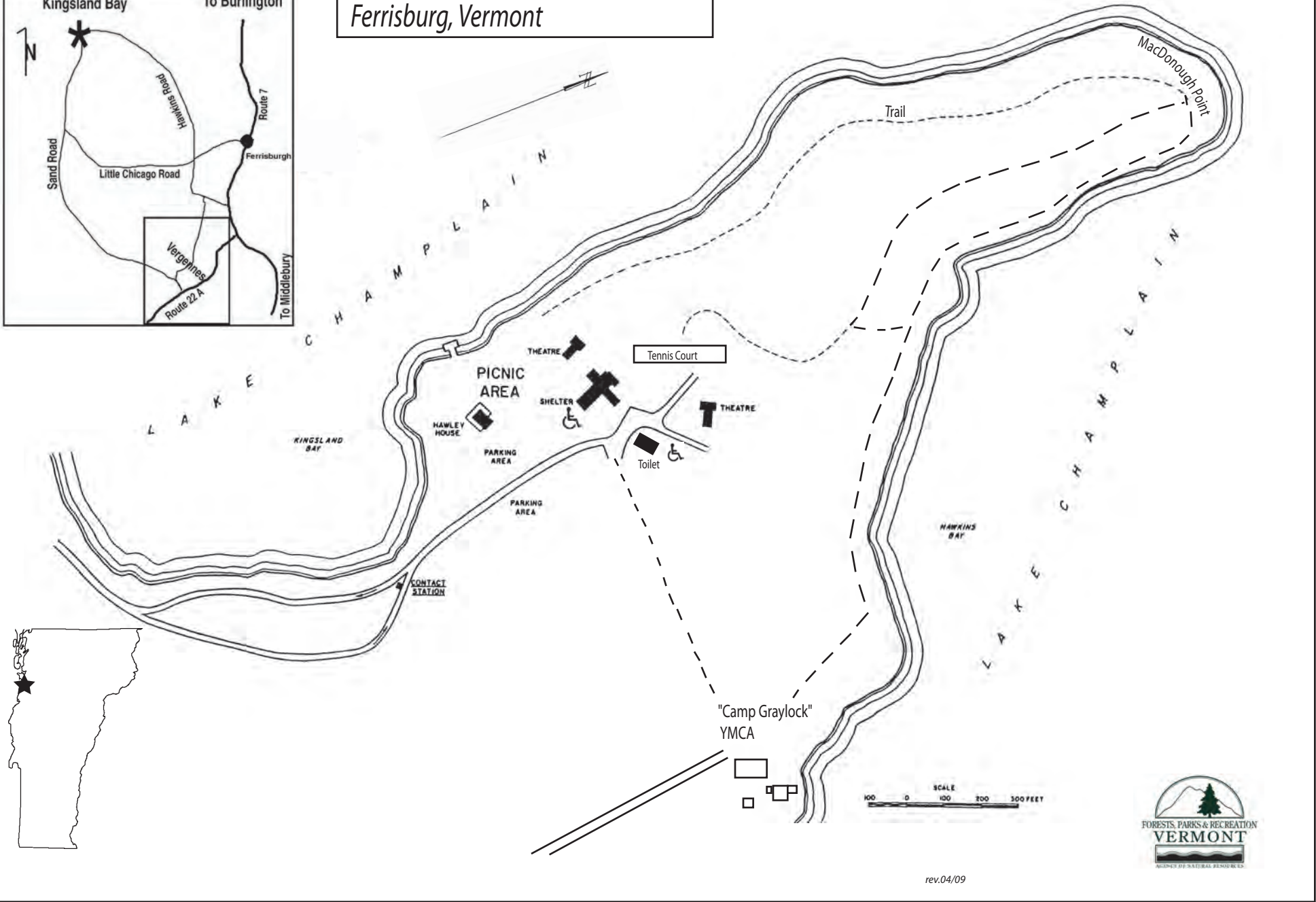
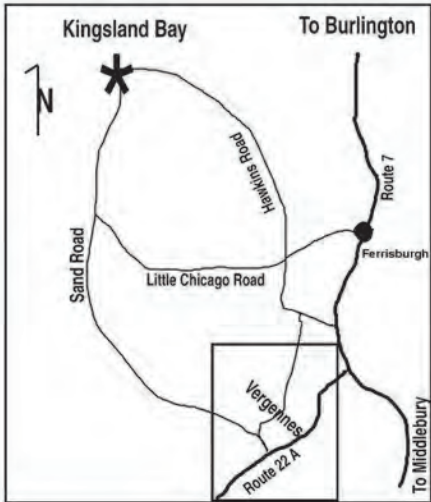

Kingsland Bay State Park

Kingsland Bay State Park sits on the shores of Lake Champlain. Much of the 264-acre park is a State Natural Area. This park is a favorite spot for events and weddings, due in large part to the picturesque backdrop of the lake.

The historic Hawley House c.1790, legend has it, was built from stones from the ruins of Fort Ticonderoga. The house served as an inn for travelers, with ferry service from Kingsland Bay across the lake to New York. The second floor served as a ballroom for dances and festivities. During the War of 1812, the Hawley House was used for housing the militia. At the turn of the century it became a monastic retreat and the bell tower was added to the structure. From 1924-1974, the house, along with a theater/ stage, served as the *L'Ecole Champlain* girls summer camp. The Hawley House has been renovated and contains local history displays developed by the Lake Champlain Maritime Museum, State Historic Sites, and Vermont State Parks.

Day Use Facilities Beautiful historic buildings are available to rent for weddings and other group functions.

Park Attractions – There are scenic trails along the shoreline of Lake Champlain. Boating, swimming, fishing and sailing are popular.
