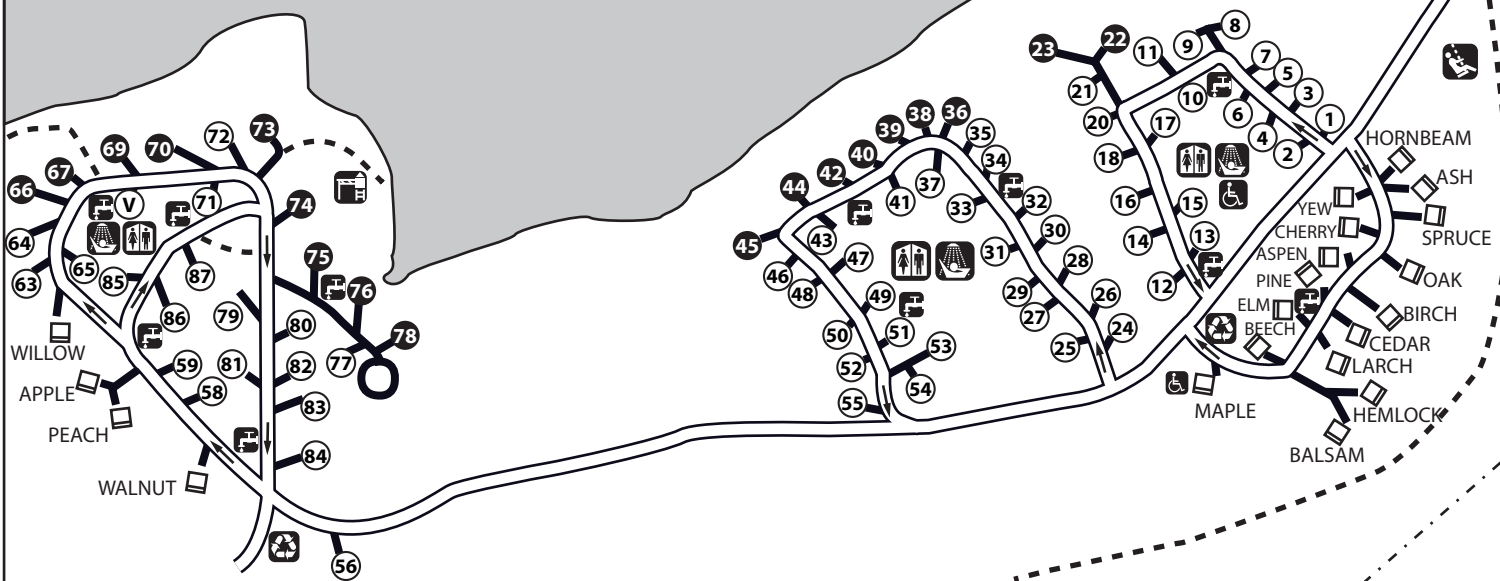

Woodford State Park

Welcome to Woodford State Park. This 398-acre park has the highest elevation campground of any park in Vermont, at 2400 feet. Woodford is located on a mountain plateau and surrounds Adams Reservoir. The high elevation spruce/fir/birch forest provides an ideal setting for the park. Woodford borders the George Aiken Wilderness Area, which is in the Green Mountain National Forest. There are several lakes and ponds in the surrounding area.

Sightseeing and Recreation in the Area

There are several hiking trails, including a 2.7 mile trail around the lake. Fishing and boating are popular activities. There are also a variety of local attractions, include:
